Please remember to read to your children. This is one of the biggest indicators of future success of students. Children should be read to every single day. Make it part of your routine. Let them pick one or two books at night, take them to the library and let them choose books that interest them.

LIMIT SCREEN TIME!! We cannot stress this enough. We see more and more children who are unable to hold conversations with others about anything other than a TV show or a video game. This is concerning! It is okay for them to be "bored." It is during these times where they use their imagination, create games and activities, and learn to entertain themselves instead of constantly needing stimulation and planned activities. Remember, YOU ARE IN CHARGE, it is okay to say no! Let them put on their coats, hang up their back packs, put on their shoes. It is good for them to struggle a little bit, this is how they learn! You will be surprised at how much they can

do on their own, it may take longer, but the more they do it, the faster and more confident they will become.

Registration for 2018... We will be contacting you via e-mail starting in January by the date that you originally applied to The Children's Center regarding placement. You do not have to fill out another application for your child(ren) who are already attending. This process takes several weeks to complete but we hope to have everyone in the school placed by Valentine's Day. We will offer you the spot(s) that we have open when we come to your name on the wait lists via e-mail. After you choose your spot we will send a contract. Remember: You should be thinking about your schedule for next year and what class options would work for your schedule. It is wise to have several choices as your first choice may not be available when we get to your name. You will have 48 hours to give us your class choice, so you want to be somewhat prepared. You will need to return the contract within 3 days with a \$150 non-refundable fee to hold your spot until September. Please remember we have a LOT of names to get through so please respect the 48 hour time frame, or we will have to move to the next name on the list.

We will need all sibling applications by December 15 to receive priority status for the next school year! It is never too early to submit an application for future school years.

If you have a child that you are thinking of delaying their departure to kindergarten or if you have one that just barely misses the kindergarten cut-off date, please contact Ms. Ogden at mckaychildcenter@gmail.com regarding our Afternoon Pre-K Plus class. This class is limited to 12 children.
