Sibling alert! Do you have a younger child that is not on our wait lists? Our 3-year old wait lists for 2019 are filling up fast and although siblings do have priority, we still go by the original date of application for class day preferences. Children do not have to be attending school now or even the next year in order to be placed on our "list" for the year they will start school. Many times we have parents submit an application for their infants.

Sibling applications must be returned by December 1, 2018 to have priority status for the 2018-19 school year.

Winter Weather Advisory: We will not go outside when something is falling from the sky, i.e., snow, rain, sleet, or when it is 32 degrees or below. Our sidewalks and parking lot are always clear so your child will not need boots or snow clothes. We follow the Adams 12 School District for weather related school closings and will leave all the fun play in the snow for you to enjoy with your children!

Happy Birthday! If your child's birthday falls during the school year, you are welcome to bring a snack for them to enjoy with their classmates. Please always be certain to double check with your child's teacher to be aware of all allergy concerns in your child's class. All snacks need to be store bought with a label listing the ingredients. PLEASE double check that items are NOT manufactured in a facility that also produces nut products (this will be on the label). We want to keep all of our children safe at school! We ask that you not bring cupcakes, due to the large amount of preschoolers and equally large amounts of frosting, not a good combo! We have morning and afternoon sessions so it is difficult to clean up in the short amount of time we have in between. Please limit your birthday treats to a small snack.

We need your help! Our next theme in the activity room is "Grocery Store." If you could save any plastic bottles (ketchup/condiments etc) and cereal boxes we would appreciate it! Please rinse and dry plastic items, and no bottles that have contained nut products please. These can be placed in the school supply box by the sign in desk. We are also collecting bottle lids, go go squeeze tops, any small pieces of recyclable material for an art project. Any of these items can just be placed on the desk in the front hall.

Our Halloween Parade will be on Monday October 30 and Tuesday, Oct. 31. If your child attends on both of those days, they will parade both days. Please be on time as the parade begins promptly at the start of school. Children come to school at their regular school time and we have a regular day, with the exception of the parade at the beginning of each session. Children should come in costumes and we will have a parade (hopefully outside). This a great photo opportunity and siblings are always welcome to join in the parade. In case of bad weather, we will have the parade inside. Please no weapons! After the parade, parents will help their children change into their regular school clothes and take their costumes home.

Plan Ahead! Our School Photographer will be here on November 13th and 14th at 8:45 or 12:30 to take individual pictures of your child or children (siblings welcome). If you want a family picture you can schedule it with the photographer through their website. They have very reasonable prices and the children do very well in our familiar environment. 3 Year Old Program: Math Skills: Numbers 2, 3, 4, 5 Small, Medium, and Large, Learning to group and sort, Introduction to number writing, Calendar Pattern ABAB, Leaf Match, categorization.

Science Skills: Fall harvest and Animal behavior, Mother Nature at work outside, Growing a pumpkin, Growing grass, Pumpkin parts, Keeping Our Balance, Going “Batty”. Our colors are orange and black.

Reading/Writing Skills: Introduction to letters F, P, M, C, name recognition, Beginning scissor skills
